STATEMENT BY AMBASSADOR SAVITRI KUNADI IN THE PLENARY MEETING OF THE CONFERENCE ON DISARMAMENT IN GENEVA, AUGUST 11, 1998

Mr. President, we welcome the establishment of an ad hoc committee on FMCT in the Conference on Disarmament today. With regard to this ad hoc committee, I wish to state the following for the record.

On 11 May, India stated its willingness to "participate in the negotiations for the conclusion of a Fissile Material Cut-off Treaty in the Geneva-based Conference on Disarmament". India has been fully supportive of the mandate contained in the UNGA resolution 48/75L, a resolution which it co-sponsored. Our support for the mandate contained in this resolution was reiterated in 1995, following the adoption of CD/1299. While remaining ready to work on the basis of the mandate contained in CD/1299, let me make it clear again that India will participate constructively in negotiations for non-discriminatory, multilateral and internationally and effectively verifiable treaty banning future production of fissile materials for nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices."
