INTERVENTION BY INDIA

Mr. President,

My delegation would like to welcome the distinguished Delegation of Uzbekistan and thank them for their informative presentation. We welcome the candid and constructive approach adopted by Uzbekistan in the preparation of their National Report while taking into account the views of a large section of civil society. It validates the principles of openness and transparency as well as that of the creation of a social partnership between the State and civil society of their Human Rights Policy.
